## electrotechnical certification scheme

Following the launch of the Network Cable Installer apprenticeship standard, an occupational qualification structure has been developed by the Network Infrastructure Industry Working Group, made up of trade associations, employer and other industry representatives to align the future industry skills need with that of the current workforce.
