What are my options if I want to apply for this type of card?	If all you are doing is visiting a site, you don't need a specific visitor card. If you are on the site for a particular purpose in relation to electrical work, you will need the card that's relevant to your occupation. A new Site Support Discipline card will be introduced for personnel that support a contract - see the next column for more details. What are the new requirements for this card? Why is this changing?	These changes have been introduced so that ECS can continue to meet Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) partnership criteria, following the announcement by the Construction Leadership Council that nationally-recognised qualifications should be in place for all construction-related occupations by 2020. The decision to withdraw the Site Visitor card is in alignment with CSCS and the Construction Leadership Council's recent announcement that not everyone needs a card to gain access to site and cards should only be issued to those working in construction related occupations.
